Polling was conducted by telephone October 29-30, 2004 during the day and in the evenings. The total sample is 1,377 registered voters (RV), with a subsample of 1,200 likely voters (LV) nationwide. For registered and likely voters there is a margin of error of ± 3 percentage points. Past results are of registered voters, unless otherwise noted.
